Dear Parents and Caregivers

We are a very busy school with many activities and opportunities for children to engage them in a positive way at school and help them to find new interests and passions.

Friday has always been a day when we have clustered extra-curricular activities and extension groups so that we do not interrupt learning in our core curriculum subjects during the week. This has always created some logistical challenges to ensure different groups and spaces do not clash on a Friday. This has also led to small numbers back in classes with their teachers, making it hard to start new learning with many children out of class doing other activities. To overcome this problem and extend the opportunities and activities that we offer children at Waikōwhai Intermediate, we have decided to create *WaiFriday*, where all teachers and students will be involved in activities they are passionate about, to help students find their 'why?'.

We have asked teachers to come up with two options that they are passionate about delivering, with the first of the options having a more academic focus. Some of the options on offer are:

Science Badges - Unlock the secrets of the natural world through hands-on experiments and investigations, earning badges as you explore the wonders of chemistry, physics, biology, and more.

Swimming - Dive into the world of swimming at Cameron Pools with our beginner's program, or our more advanced programme! Learn essential water safety skills and basic strokes in a supportive and encouraging environment, or extend the skills that you have. Whether you're dipping your toes for the first time or eager to improve your technique, our swimming program will help you build confidence and proficiency in the water.

Acting / Screen acting - Step into the spotlight and unleash your dramatic talents as you explore the art of acting for stage and screen, mastering techniques to bring characters to life and captivate audiences.

Music Theory - Dive into the fundamentals of music theory, learning to read notation, understand rhythm and melody, and explore the building blocks of musical composition.

Children will have the full range of options shared with them by their classroom teachers on Monday in Week 8, 18 March, and will then choose three options they are interested in, so we are able to create a time table and class lists. WaiFriday will start from the second Friday of Term 2.

Please have a discussion with your child about the options that they have selected. Some of the activities may need to include a small fee to cover the costs of materials used.
